- * **Be Prepared Radio Broadcast:** An archive of short public service announcements featuring emergency preparedness tips/information for Georgians with disabilities developed through GARRS and featuring Coalition Partners.
- Emergency Preparedness Brochure for Individuals with Disabilities & Older Adults: Created as a handy reference to help individuals with disabilities and older adults prepare for emergency situations.
- * Establishment of the Disability Community Network: A network of more than 50 disability service providers around the state, who provide emergency preparedness information to agencies and organizations that serve individuals with access and functional needs.
- * **First Responders Tips Guide:** A quick reference guide that provides specific, practical tips for working with people who have a wide range of abilities.
- * NOAA Weather Radio with Accessories for Individuals with Disabilities Brochure: A brochure that explains the use of the weather radio and the accessories available for alerting individuals who are blind, deaf or hard of hearing.
- Ready Georgia Campaign (www.ready.ga.gov): This website includes planning tools and a phone app with information for individuals with disabilities and access to a preparedness video in American Sign Language (ASL).
- * State of Georgia Functional Needs Support Services (FNSS) Toolkit: A resource guide that identifies specific functional needs support services throughout the State of Georgia.
- Train-the-Trainer: This workshop provides participants with the tools, guidance, and techniques necessary to assist the individuals they serve with emergency preparedness and planning.
